

It's Loaves and Fishes Time Again! Every year our church family looks forward to coming together to serve the hungry and homeless in Trenton in a tangible, immediate way. The Trenton Area Soup Kitchen provides meals in Trenton during the week but is closed on the weekends. On weekends groups from around Mercer County pitch in to help with this essential task. Nassau Church has been doing this for 16 years. Last year over 200 of our folks participated as we fed hundreds of Trenton residents a light breakfast and a delicious hot dinner and gave them bagged lunches to take with them. This is great opportunity to demonstrate our hospitality and love to those most in need, and a lot of fun to boot! This year, we will be serving in Trenton on **Saturday, August 22**. Why not plan on joining us and make it a family affair – either by bringing mom, dad, kids and cousins, or by joining our Nassau Church family.

As you read this we bet you are wondering how can I get in on all this fun! Glad you asked - we need **meatloaf makers**--the recipe is printed below and we have plenty of room to freeze your work ahead of time; **cookie bakers**--you choose your favorite kind and we can freeze these, too; folks who want to **work in Trenton that day**--in the kitchen, packing lunches and waiting on tables; and people who would like to make a **cash donation**--so we can buy the food and supplies we need. If you are interested, we will have a sign-up sheet at fellowship time after worship starting July 14. Recipes and more details will be available there; the meatloaf recipe also appears below. Meatloaf Recipe

- 1 envelope Lipton Recipe Secrets Onion-Mushroom Soup Mix
- 2 pounds ground beef
- 1 1/2 cups fresh bread crumbs
- 2 eggs
- 3/4 cup water
- 1/3 cup ketchup

Preheat oven to 350°. Combine all ingredients in a large bowl. Bake in a disposable loaf pan one hour or until done. If you don't use a disposable pan, please remove it from the pan and wrap it in foil before you bring it to the church.

If you can, please drop off your meatloaves at the **Nassau Church kitchen on Friday, August 21**, by 2:00 p.m. If that drop off time does not work for you, you can drop your meatloaves off anytime between now and August 21. They can be placed in the freezer in the church kitchen – just look for the marked shelves.

**Driving Directions
St. Mary's Cathedral**

151 North Warren Street, Trenton, NJ

1. Take Route 1 **South**. (Where Route 1 and Business Route 1 divide, remain on Route 1 (that is, stay left).)
2. Get off at the **Perry Street exit**. Make a **left at the top of the exit ramp** onto Perry Street.
3. Proceed **straight down Perry Street**, through the intersections with North Stockton, North Montgomery and North Broad. You will soon see the Cathedral ahead of you, at the **corner of Perry Street / Bank Street and North Warren Street**.
4. There is plenty of free secure parking behind the Cathedral.
