

## Directions to Camp Kenbrook:

### *From New Jersey:*

Take I-78 west to exit #6 (Lebanon/Fredericksburg). This exit will go directly to Route 22 west. Take Route 22 west to Fredericksburg. At the traffic light in Fredericksburg turn left. This will be Route 343 south. Take 343 south approximately 3 miles to Pine Meadow Rd. Pine Meadow Golf Course will be on the right. Turn right at the sign for the golf course. This is Pine Meadow Road. Travel approximately 1 ¾ miles on Pine Meadow Rd. to Kenbrook.

### *From Hershey:*

Follow Route 743 N. At Route 22, turn right and travel east approximately 9 miles, or until the first stoplight. At traffic light turn right onto Rt 343. Follow 2 1/2 miles until Pine Meadow Road, near the Wetlands restaurant. Turn right onto Pine Meadow Road, proceed 1 1/2 miles. Kenbrook is on the right and marked with a large sign at the entrance.

Well-told stories move us, change our moods and attitudes, and spark ah-ha moments about ourselves and our world. In the characters we most love or hate, we see ourselves, our friends, and our enemies; in the complexities of plot, we recognize how choice and chance shape a life.



Exploring our reactions to stories in the Bible can invite this kind of self-reflection, as well as interpersonal sharing. Far more nuanced than the children's versions of the stories might suggest, these narratives show people who—like us—struggle with relationships, families, and conflicting social expectations.

At this retreat, we'll compare our responses to two stories: the book of Ruth and the film *Fried Green Tomatoes*. We'll pay special attention to how we fill in the "gaps" of these stories—the information that's not given and the motives that aren't named. Through the process of journaling, small group conversation, and creative writing, we'll play in the intersection of sacred stories with our own. What can we learn about ourselves and each other from what we unconsciously add to a story?

## Meet our Retreat Leaders...



**Julia M. O'Brien** is Professor of Hebrew Bible/Old Testament at Lancaster Theological Seminary. She received her B.A. in religion from Wake Forest University, and her M.Div. and Ph.D. from Duke University. She specializes in the prophetic literature of the Old Testament and is the Editor in Chief of the *Oxford Encyclopedia of the Bible and Gender Studies*.

**Anabel C. Proffitt** is Associate Professor of Educational Ministries at Lancaster Theological Seminary. She is a graduate of Princeton Theological Seminary (Ph.D.), the Presbyterian School of Christian Education (M.A.) and Hood College (B.A.). An ordained minister in the United Church of Christ, she serves as a consistory member and adult Sunday school teacher at Hamilton Park United Church of Christ in Lancaster. During the summer months she serves as pastor of Childwold Memorial Presbyterian Church in Adirondack Park in upstate New York.
